

Jon Hiser, Chief Ranger stated:

“The idea for the Rom-Tec came about from our in-house PDT that put a modernization concept plan for Quarry together. We knew using a pre-fab would be more cost-effective than building one from scratch, give the overhead for design and engineering. The uni-sex design was an idea that I picked up from my camping trips throughout the country. The idea of privacy, along with being able to serve a wider number of visitors, male or female, got us searching for such a facility and Rom-Tec had one that fit the bill. It also allows us to open or close stalls as needed, depending upon seasons and use. We've heated two stalls and are operating them through the winter this year. The footprint of the structure is small, and we placed adjacent to an existing parking area, saving a little more. The uni-sex, six stall design allows greater flexibility in use by visitors, and by having a lavatory, toilet, and shower all contained in the same stall, visitors are afforded more privacy than traditional designs. The final cost of the project is \$148,000 - roughly half what our last contractor-built restroom and shower cost.”
