SUBJECT: Renewal of Office of Management and Budget Generic Clearance for *the Questionnaires for U.S. Army Engineer Civil Works Studies and Projects*.

1. Reference CECW-PD/CECW-ON memorandum, subject: Office of Management and Budget Clearance for *the Questionnaires for U.S. Army Engineer Civil Works Studies and Projects*, dated 14 April 1999. (Encl) The referenced memorandum provided notice that OMB had given generic clearance for a three-year period for the Corps to use a set of approved questionnaires to conduct public surveys. In addition, the referenced memorandum transmitted guidance for the use of the approved questionnaires.
2. The current OMB clearance expires on 31 March 2002. The approval process, as established by the Paperwork Reduction Act (Public Law 104-13) and the OMB regulations, requires approximately 6 months from the time the Corps request is submitted to the Office of the Secretary of the Army until final action by OMB. This memorandum requests your review of the current set of questionnaires to determine its adequacy for the upcoming 3-year period. Please submit suggested changes, deletions and additional requirements for questions by 1 June 2001. Your requirements should be consolidated by Division and submitted to your respective HQUSACE POC, with a copy to Mr. Stuart Davis, the Institute for Water Resources (IWR).
3. The subject civil works public survey package, OMB number 0710-0001, includes both planning surveys and natural resources recreation (operations) surveys. Any set of questions asked by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers of 10 or more respondents outside the Federal Government must originate from OMB-approved questionnaires. This requirement also applies to contractors and local sponsors conducting public surveys in support of Corps studies and operational activities.
4. The existing approved questionnaires are available for review at the IWR Internet site at: <http://www.iwr.usace.army.mil/iwr/omb/OMBHOMEA.HTM>. In addition to the approved questionnaires, the site includes the referenced 1999 memorandum, with instructions on survey implementation, including the 10-day approval process for each individual survey effort and the requirement for annual burden hour reporting.

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5. Please examine the current set of questionnaires on the IWR Internet site and determine if it adequately addresses potential general topics and specific subject matter areas. Please be aware that the OMB regulations allow a user to extract combinations of questions from the approved questionnaires to create a new questionnaire applicable to the specific area or problem being evaluated. When creating a new questionnaire, only questions included in the *Questionnaires for U.S. Army Engineer Civil Works Studies and Projects* may be asked. Wording changes in specific question items, however, are permissible to reflect more accurately the specific context of the survey.

6. ## MEMORANDUM FOR SEE DISTRIBUTION

SUBJECT: Office of Management and Budget Clearance for *the Questionnaires for U.S. Army Engineer Civil Works Studies and Projects*.

1. This letter transmits instructions on clearance for *the Questionnaires for U.S. Army Engineer Civil Works Studies and Projects* and provides guidance on use of the questionnaires. The Office of Management and Budget (OMB) has given approval for the use of these questionnaires in accordance with the Paperwork Reduction Act of 1995 (Public Law 104-13). This approval includes both planning surveys under OMB number 0710-0001 and natural resources management (operations) surveys formerly under OMB number 0710-0002. Any set of questions asked by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers of 10 or more respondents outside the Federal Government must originate from OMB-approved questionnaires. This requirement also applies to contractors and local sponsors conducting public surveys in support of Corps studies.

2. Questionnaire items are to be used in accordance with the following guidance:

a. The division commander shall designate one point of contact to review all planning survey submittals and one point of contact to review all operations survey submittals. The division office must review the individual questionnaire for quality control before district use. Division quality control review should be based upon the need for the questionnaire and the reasonableness and adequacy of:

- (1) The research questions to be answered;
- (2) The sampling strategy being employed;
- (3) The data collection procedures being employed, including follow-up procedures;
- (4) The data analysis plan; and
- (5) The consistency with OMB-approved questionnaires.

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**b. No survey may be conducted until final approval is received from OMB.**

Each survey must be submitted to both OMB and Office of The Secretary of Defense, to the point of contact listed below. The submittal must contain a one to two paragraph narrative which explains the following:

- (1) The purpose of the survey;
- (2) Where and when the survey is to be conducted;
- (3) A statement about the population to be surveyed;
- (4) The approximate sample size;
- (5) The sample selection methodology; and
- (6) Direct references to the corresponding surveys and question numbers in

*Questionnaires for U.S. Army Engineer Civil Works Studies and Projects*.

c. The division point of contact should submit survey applications by E-mail directly to Robert Cushing (“[cushingr@osd.pentagon.mil](mailto:cushingr@osd.pentagon.mil)”) at the Office of The Secretary of Defense and James Laity (“[jlaity@omb.eop.gov](mailto:jlaity@omb.eop.gov)”) at the Office of Management and Budget. For information purposes, copies of each questionnaire should also be sent to the appropriate Headquarters point of contact listed in paragraph 5 and Mr. Stuart Davis, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Institute for Water Resources, Casey Building, #2594, 7701 Telegraph Road, Alexandria, Virginia 22315-3868. OMB will review survey within ten business days of request.

d. If necessary, a user may extract combinations of questions from the approved questionnaires as applicable to the area and problem being evaluated. Only questions included in the *Questionnaires for U.S. Army Engineer Civil Works Studies and Projects* may be asked however, wording changes in question items are permissible to reflect more appropriately the specific context of the survey. Wherever possible, OMB-approved questionnaires should be used without alteration. In cases where wording changes or the addition or omission of questions is required to meet the specific questionnaire objectives, the division point of contact is expected to determine consistency with OMB-approved questionnaires. Because all of the generic questionnaires have been pre-approved by OMB, OMB is primarily interested in reviewing the sampling methodology and any changes to the generic questionnaires. Keeping such changes to a minimum will expedite final approval.

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e. Questionnaire construction and administration should follow professional practices of design and data collection. The Institute of Water Resources or the Waterways Experiment Station can provide such assistance, if there are insufficient in-house resources available.

f. The major purpose of the OMB restrictions on questionnaires is to reduce the burden on the public in providing the government with data. For these purposes, any set of questions asked of 10 or more respondents is covered by the regulations. In addition to using well-designed questionnaires asked of the appropriate persons, the public burden can be reduced by keeping questionnaires short, whenever possible.

g. All respondents must be informed of the purpose of the questionnaire, of the fact that their replies are voluntary and of the level of confidentiality of the information. For cases where responses are mandatory, such as certain surveys of waterway operators, respondents must be informed of any adverse consequences of failing to answer the questions.

h. The OMB number, 0710-0001, and the expiration date of 31 March 2002 must be placed on the coversheet of each questionnaire. Respondents to interviewer-administered questionnaires must be informed of the OMB control number. Respondents must also be informed that an agency may not conduct or sponsor, and a person is not required to respond to, a collection of information unless it displays a currently valid OMB control number.

3. Finally, each division must submit an annual report to the appropriate Headquarters, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers point of contact, by 1 November 1999, and each year through 1 November 2002. Headquarters is required to send a copy of this report to OMB. This report must contain the following information:

a. The number of surveys conducted in the preceding fiscal year in the division;

b. For each survey conducted, the purpose of the survey, location of the survey, the number of respondents, and the number of burden hours used (burden hours are computed by multiplying the number of respondents by the average length of time to answer the survey); and

c. An estimate of the number of burden hours expected in the current fiscal year.

4. The questionnaires are available at the IWR web site at: ([www.wrsc.usace.army.mil/iwr/omb/html/OMBHOMEA.HTM](http://www.wrsc.usace.army.mil/iwr/omb/html/OMBHOMEA.HTM)). Once the site comes up, simply click

on a survey title and it will load directly into Microsoft Word®. To avoid formatting problems, it is best to use a computer with Microsoft Word 97®.
