

The Federal Lakes Recreation Pilot Lake Demonstration Program

Workshop and Training Course

December 11-14, 2001
Phoenix, AZ

What: This meeting will consist of two parts. The first part will be a follow-up workshop to the Federal Lakes Recreation Pilot Lake Demonstration workshop that was held at Lake Lanier, GA. in Dec. 2000. This workshop will focus on a review of the actions and events that have taken place at the 31 pilot demonstration lakes (see attached list). Emphasis will be on reporting actions attempted and the resultant level of success. A special focus will be on those activities performed in conjunction with existing or potential managing partners. Products will include status reports of demonstration efforts, a listing of activities that worked and didn't work, and proposed actions to be implemented by the Federal Lakes Recreation Leadership Council. **Present for part of the workshop will be the Council Co-chairs, Commissioner Keys of the Bureau of Reclamation and General Griffin of the Corps of Engineers. They will reinforce the Council's support of the pilot lake demonstration and charge the group to propose future Council actions.**

The second part of the meeting will be a training course on Marina Management conducted by the Marina Operator's Association of America. This course will cover a wide range of subjects and issues related to planning, development and management of marinas which are the hub of water related recreation activities at Federal lakes. The training course will be conducted immediately following the workshop.

When: The workshop and training course are scheduled for December 11-14, 2001

Who: The target audience for the workshop is the lake managers of the 31 pilot lakes. The lake managers and agency employees that deal with marinas regularly should attend the training course.

Where: The workshop and training course will take place in Phoenix, AZ. and at Lake Pleasant, AZ
