








PROPERTY PROTECTION PROGRAM:

- *To be modeled after Bureau of Reclamation, Bonneville Power Administration, and Neighborhood Crime Witness Program (Crime Watch Programs).*

PROPERTY PROTECTION PROGRAM:

- *The USACE Property Protection utilized the Bonneville Power Administration Crime Witness Program as a model program.*
- *Since this program began in 1994, BPA has received hundreds of telephone tips resulting in dozens of arrests and \$2 Million dollars in restitution.*

PROPERTY PROTECTION PROGRAM:

- *This initiative was developed to reduce vandalism, larceny, arson, environmental and cultural degradation of government property at USACE projects.*



PROJECTS AND FACILITIES:

Nationally, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers operates over 4,331 recreation areas at 462 lakes and waterways in 43 states including over 12 million acres of land and water.

The largest outdoor recreation provider in the federal government.



CORPS WATCH PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT:

- *Each year, millions of dollars in property are lost due to vandalism, larceny, arson and environmental and cultural degradation.*



CORPS WATCH PROGRAM **DEVELOPMENT:**

- *This program is designed to heighten public awareness of the seriousness of the impacts of crime within or around dams, lakes, navigation locks, recreation areas and other Corps facilities and property.*



CORPS WATCH **IMPLEMENTATION:**

- *Section 205 of the Water Resources Development Act of 2000 provides authority for the Secretary of the Army to establish a program to reduce vandalism and destruction of property at Civil Works Water Resource Development Projects under the jurisdiction of the Department of the Army.*



CORPS WATCH IMPLEMENTATION:

- *To protect Corps assets this act provides for the payment of cash rewards of \$100 to \$1,000 to be paid to individuals who provide information leading to the arrest and/or acceptance for prosecution of offenders.*



CORPS WATCH IMPLEMENTATION:

Corps seeks assistance in solving crime

CROOKED CREEK LAKE – The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers seeks assistance in identifying the vandals who spray painted graffiti and destroyed property at Crooked Creek Lake last week. Graffiti was spray painted on the Outflow Stilling Basin Wall of the Crooked Creek Dam and the interior and exterior of the restroom facility in the Outflow Recreation Area. The interior walls of the restroom, a bulletin board and park bench in the Outflow Recreation Area were also vandalized. The crime, which resulted in approximately \$3,500 in damages, occurred sometime between 8:00 a.m. Sunday, April 17 and 7:00 a.m. Monday, April 18. Any individual with knowledge or information of this incident is encouraged to call Corps Watch toll-free at 1-866-413-7970. Callers can remain anonymous and may be eligible to receive a cash reward of \$100 to \$1,000.

The Pittsburgh District is serving as the test district for **Corps Watch**, a neighborhood crime-watch deterrence program to protect U.S. Army Corps of Engineers assets. Each year, millions of dollars in property are lost due to vandalism, larceny, arson and environmental and cultural degradation. This program is designed to heighten public awareness of the seriousness of the impacts of crime within or around dams, lakes, navigation locks, recreation areas and other Corps facilities.

To help fight these crimes and reduce operations and maintenance costs, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers has received Congressional authority to offer cash rewards of up to \$1,000 for information leading to the arrest and prosecution of individuals causing damage to Corps of Engineers property. Individuals who witness or suspect that a crime has been committed against Corps property are encouraged to use the toll-free number, 1-866-413-7970, to report information of theft, vandalism or any other threats or suspicious activity against Corps property 24-hours a day. Callers can remain anonymous.

During a teleconference conducted 27 September 2005 a determination was made that the Corps Watch Program would be implemented nationwide with the Pittsburgh District serving as the National Operations Center (NOC). This decision was based on the pilot test projects acceptance of the program, program success and demonstrated value as a deterrent.



CECW-ON/PITTSBURGH **DISTRICT CHARTER:**

- *Pittsburgh District would conduct a nationwide Corps Watch phase-in with each participating (voluntary) District/Division during FY06/07 .*
- *Coordinate implementation with HQ and establish a reporting structure with ENGLink.*


