



Back-in with straight entrance.  
Note lack of side by side parking.

Back-in with dogleg. Note wide entrance for ease of entrance and parking. Also note site width needed for slide ins.



Back-in with ramp down and dog leg.  
Note lack of cut and fill required when you build on the contours.

Avoid stacking ties whenever possible and it should be possible. You have to have faith in this philosophy.



Steps should be avoided too!




The view from the back of this site leads you to believe there is still more room to back up. The front view tells that the camper did the best he could. Also note the branches that are interfering with the awning. If the branches are not removed what do you think will happen?



Folks like to get around the fire. If we do not stick the fire ring in the corner they can arrange themselves to better suit their needs.



Ramp down – note straight entrance to allow easier backing.
